YOUR BAR TRAINING WITH THE ICCA

Designed to equip you with the knowledge and vital practitioner skills required to achieve success in pupillage, you will experience an innovative Bar training course delivered in two parts using a combination of in-person teaching, e-learning and self-study.

PART 1

On Part One, the knowledge subjects of Civil litigation/ADR and Criminal litigation are delivered online, designed by experienced practitioners and academics utilising technology to its fullest potential to take you into the courtroom and experience law in practice. Our extensive question bank and bespoke interactive learning and testing techniques are designed to fully prepare you for all assessments.

Students interact with one another in both social and study groups and engage with staff in online forums and revision webinars. Pastoral support, careers advice and invitations to extracurricular events are available to all students.

Part One commences in September 2024 or January 2025 and can be completed following a guided pathway (over 12-14 weeks) or self-paced over a longer period, accessing the course content at any time of day and from any location, a flexible option for those with work or caring responsibilities.

Your Part One fee of £3,147 includes the BSB levy and all the text books and learning resources required to take your BSB assessments.

PART 2

Having successfully completed Part One by passing your BSB centrally set assessments in Civil litigation/ ADR and Criminal litigation, you will enrol on Part Two which is taught in-person within bespoke training facilities at the Inns of Court: Gray's Inn, Lincoln's Inn, Inner Temple and Middle Temple. Your in-person teaching is supported by bespoke online materials and research resources.

Your focus now turns to developing the skills of Advocacy (submissions, examination-in-chief and cross-examination); Conference skills; Opinion Writing & Legal Research; and Drafting. You will also receive tuition in Professional Ethics via an online module, ensuring that you are fully conversant with the Code of Conduct and the highest standards of ethical behaviour at the Bar.

Part Two commences in either March or September each year and takes place over 17-19 weeks (depending on your start date). All teaching staff are experienced practitioners and educational specialists, and all students are taught in small groups, ensuring individual attention and feedback.

You will have the opportunity to join the advocacy committee to further enhance your advocacy skills and undertake pro bono opportunities with Advocate.

Your Part Two fee of £12,588 includes the BSB levy and all learning resources required. No Part Two fee is payable unless and until you enrol on Part Two and flexible payment options are available.

WELLBEING, DISABILITY AND LEARNING SUPPORT

COURSE AWARD, CALL TO THE BAR AND COMMENCING PUPILLAGE

Success on the ICCA Bar Course allows you to be called to the Bar of England & Wales and to be awarded a Postgraduate Diploma (PGDip) in Bar Practice from King's College London, the ICCA'S validating academic partner. (Please note that call to the Bar also requires completion of Qualifying Sessions with your Inn and passing a 'fit and proper person' test.) Success on the ICCA Bar Course will also allow you to commence pupillage with your chosen pupillage or work-based training provider.



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APPLICATIONS

The ICCA has taken a new approach to Bar training, designed for students who are motivated, bright, dedicated and diligent with a realistic chance of attaining the standard required for an award of pupillage, irrespective of your social, cultural and economic background,

All applications are considered in accordance with the ICCA Fair Admissions Policy. This means that all candidates are measured against the same fair and transparent criteria. We do not take into account either the school or university you attended or your protected characteristics. All admissions assessors receive training in equality and diversity and unconscious bias avoidance.
